In 1963, the Illinois State Legislature passed House Bill 708...the Community Mental Health Act.

This bill gave the residents of local governmental units the opportunity to vote on a referendum to provide community mental health facilities and services, including facilities for persons with intellectual/developmental disabilities and those with substance use disorders.

In the general election of 1970, the people of Aurora, Batavia, Big Rock, Blackberry, Kaneville, and Sugar Grove Townships in South Kane County took this opportunity to fund the growing mental health needs in their communities, and passed the "708" referendum overwhelmingly. Virgil passed the referendum in 2000.

This was the beginning of a unique arrangement for cooperation in funding and planning. As prescribed by state statute, each township appoints a seven member community mental health board. Each of these boards is called a "708" board, after the law that created it. The seven "708" boards pool their funds and administrative costs in support of an umbrella board, INC Board, for planning and financing mental health services in the seven township area.

This is an introduction to the primary agencies currently funded by INC.



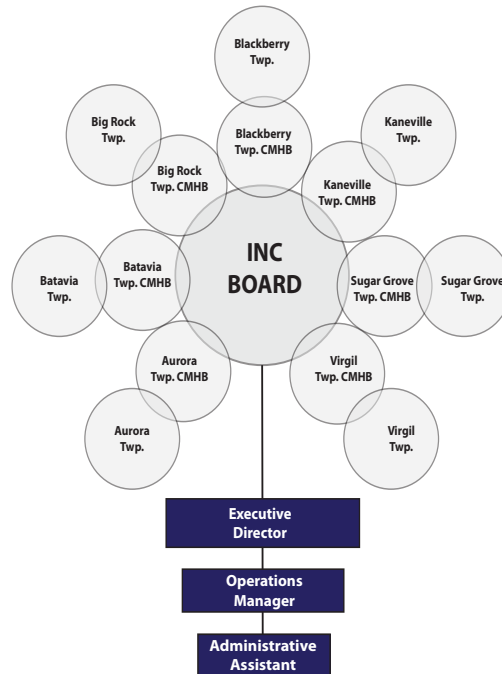
